Addressing Fair Housing Accommodation Requests

Knock, knock . . .

- It always begins with a request
 - It is illegal to ask first, wait for a request for an accommodation
 - Does not have to be in writing preferable though
 - It may come from a resident or from someone thinking about residing there
 - Never refuse until you've done your due diligence

Who is it?

• Is the request for a disabled person?

- Sometimes the person is obviously disabled
- When it is not clear right/duty to verify disability

Are you eligible?

There are several ways to establish disability

- Do you have a disability that affects a major life function?
- Letter from a health care provider
- DMV hanger/license plates
- Person with a therapeutic relationship
- Don't ask if the disability is obvious/known

What do you want?

Typical and atypical requested accommodations

- Assistance animal (dog, cat, chicken, iguana, tiger cub)
- Uncarpeted hardwood floors
- Permission to add a sunroom
- Microphones and speakers for meetings
- Parking space
- Security camera
- Curb cut
- Change pesticide or fertilizer
- Pay for alternate housing during elevator repair
- Social budget adjustment to include handicap-friendly events

Is it reasonable & necessary?

- Will the accommodation help?
- Is there a nexus between the accommodation and the disability?
- Is there an alternative that makes more sense?
- Is the accommodation unduly burdensome?
- Would the accommodation materially alter the Association's operations?

When do you need it?

- Justice delayed is justice denied
- Timing is relative

That's so annoying, what can we do?

Violation of the Covenants?

- Use Restrictions
- Nuisance provision annoying, offensive or unlawful?

• Not a Violation of Covenants?

- Violations of state law
- Violations of local ordinances

Possible Abatement Options

- Self-help
- Violation charges/suspension of privileges
- Injunctive relief
- Referral to third-party (e.g., local Code Enforcement Office)

What's that smell...?

- Smoking
 - Is there a prohibition?
 - Recorded Covenants or Rules/Regulations
 - Tobacco vs. marijuana is there a difference?
 - Handling owner complaints
 - Abatement options
- Cooking smells
- Candles
- Pet odors

Do you hear that?

- Noises
 - Is there a prohibition?
 - Recorded Covenants or Rules/Regulations
 - Handling owner complaints
 - Abatement options
- Dogs barking
- Children playing

Isn't this annoying too?

- Overgrown or unkempt yards
- Trash cans left out
- Hoarding

- Neighbor to Neighbor Disputes
